4X#2: Maribor, SLO: 08-09.06.2002

King and Chausson Win Maribor Four-Cross

Mike King (USA, Haro/Lee Dungarees) and **Anne-Caroline Chausson** (FRA, Volvo-Cannondale) dominated a steep and fast course on the slopes above Maribor, Slovenia Saturday night, winning round two of the **Tissot-UCI Mountain Bike World Cup 4X** competition.



While for Chausson it was her second-straight win, for the veteran rider King it was a sweet confirmation of his speed - against friend and rival **Brian Lopes** (*USA*, *Fox/GT*). Crowds were large and enthusiastic at this night-time event, filling the ski slope above the finish line for more than an hour of exciting racing.

The men's event was a large and fast-moving series as usual on this steep hill at Maribor, as 64 riders qualified for the main

event. Racing got underway at 8:00 p.m., so riders competed under the bright lights of the ski slope, finishing the track in just over 30 seconds as they attempted to get the best position out of the first turn and thus dominate the run.

And King, who has double duty as both 4X racer and team manager of his Haro/Lee Dungarees team, won his first 4X as well as his first world cup in several seasons when he outmaneuvered rival and champion Brian Lopes (USA, Fox/GT) in the first crucial turn.

"The big thing for me is that I beat Brian, whom I've been racing for years," said a happy King afterward. "I knew I was strong out of the gate, and I also knew it would be a drag race. I rested a lot this weekend, and things worked out great."

King, who has raced and won every discipline of the downhill, commented on the new 4X format, saying "The new format's exciting, and everything went my way. There's lot of action, and three other people to worry about. This course was different, and I ran a full-suspension bike which helped me."

Fifth-seeded King had his work cut out for himself in the final run, as he went up against third-seeded Lopes - a rival against whom he has raced since they were children. He also had **Steve Peat** (GBR, Royal/Orange) to contend with - along with teammate **Kirt Voreis** (USA, Haro/Lee Dungarees). The four left the gate and things quickly heated up from there. With a long and bumpy straight-away that dropped into a hard, high-banked right hand turn, Maribor's course demanded a strong start and nerves of steel.

"Mike made a good move and we battled into that first turn," said Lopes after he finished second just ahead of Peat. "He got inside me, then I crashed trying to catch up to him again." Lopes crashed after drifting too far and losing tire grip on the track, finishing his run with an injured leg for the second week in a row. "I thought I had him, but he ran a great race," said Lopes.





Peat, who finished third, called the finals a "war zone," adding "Brian went down and Kirt came inside of him, but his bike was sideways. I went right over the top of them. I got lucky today, because I was seeing stars during the finals."

Peat was referring to a crash he had with top-seeding **Cedric Gracia** (FRA, Volvo-Cannondale) in a previous run, where he ran across the finish to advance. With his second-place finish, Lopes retains the Tissot leader's jersey for another week as the series leader.
