

Diesel/UCI Mountain Bike World Cup - 1999



Bromont, CAN - dh#7 - 7-8 August 1999 - Report / Rapport

On a rainy Sunday in Quebec, **Nicolas Vouilloz (FRA)** reasserted his hold on the men's category of the Diesel/UCI Downhill World Cup. His compatriot, **Anne-Caroline Chausson (FRA)** continued her dominance of the women's field. Both riders won on a course that was considered one of the most technically demanding of the year, and made tougher by the wettest conditions imaginable.

Overnight, the rain, which had abated for the Swatch Dual on Saturday, came back with a vengeance, turning the dirt into soupy mud. Paradoxically, this made the rock sections more feasible, by washing away mud and enabling tires to grip better.

Women – Chausson at Her Grimy Best

Giovanna Bonazzi (ITA), the two-times world champion set the early fast time in the women's field, at 6:13.01. Yet she knew that it would not last, and just a few riders later **Elke Brutsaert (USA)** knocked over 6.5" off Bonazzi's time to take the lead. Spectators were then treated to the unusual sight of Chausson racing in the middle of the pack, instead of her customary last spot. The world champion had crashed and flatted during the seeding run, forcing her to ride early in the final.

Chausson's major concern was being held up by the rider in front - **Kim Huard (CAN)**, but the Canadian sportingly prevented any controversy. Chausson recounted that, *"I told her (Huard) that I would yell 'hup hup' as I came up behind. She (Huard) was great, and moved right out of my way, not slowing me down at all."* Afterwards, Huard stated *"It is not my place to stay in the way of the World Champion."*

Chausson rode superbly, floating through the rocky sections that created problems for so many other riders. She came rocketing across the finish line with 5'25.19", a time 15" faster than **Missy Giove's (USA)** top qualifying run.

And then came the wait in the Hot Seat. As rider after rider came down, it became apparent that no one would get close to Chausson's mark. Numerous riders managed nudge below the six-minute mark, but only barely. **Marla Streb (USA)**, the third last rider down, went closer, with a 5:45.44 run. Then **Katja Repo (FIN)**, the next rider in, continued the best season of her career by dipping under Streb's time with a 5:43.90, which gave her second place – her best world cup race result.

If anyone were to beat Chausson today, it would have been her arch-rival Giove. Well, maybe it was the pressure, or maybe it was the shoulder injury that required the American rider to tape herself up. Whatever the reason, it was apparent from the intermediate time check that Chausson had scored another victory. Giove crashed on the upper slopes of the course and finished with a fourth-place time, of 5'46".
