## France's Pascal and Finland's Repo Take Downhill #6 Wins

**Mickael Pascal** (FRA, Be-One Team) and **Katja Repo** (FIN, Team GT) dominated a tough field of competitors - and a tough downhill track - to capture victory in round six of the **Tissot-UCI Mountain Bike World Cup** in Leysin, Switzerland.

With unpredictable rains and tricky course conditions ruling the day, it was never clear who would prevail on the steep mountains above Lake Geneva. But thousands of fans came out to watch the excitement, this season's first triple event held in Europe.

**Mickael Pascal** (FRA, Be-One Team) won his first world cup ever two rounds ago in Colorado, and in the rain. But this week was different, as all of the top-qualifiers had the same course conditions during the finals - if anything the track got faster as time progressed. So Pascal was able to take satisfaction from his well-deserved victory today, as he qualified fourth-fastest and then held on for the win.

"I just wanted to get down the course with no crash," smiled Pascal after his run. "All the people had the same weather though, so I'm very happy with this win."

Rains fell in the early part of the men's final, as 80 men made their run down the slippery mountain much more slowly than during qualifying. **Marcus Klausmann** (GER, MK Racing Team) was the 22nd man to arrive at the finish, his impressive time of 4:58 fast enough to keep him in the hotseat until the 67th finalist - **David Vazquez** 

**Lopez** (ESP, Giant) - finally unseated him. Then, with four riders remaining, Pascal overtook the hotseat.

Pascal beat this week's runner-up **Greg Minnaar** (RSA, Global Racing Team) by three seconds, as Minnaar was second-fastest in qualifying as well. "I'm not that good a mud rider," said Minnaar. "So I thought I would let loose a bit. I didn't crash, but my feet were out and I was out of control for a bit!"

Last year's winner here, **Cedric Gracia** (FRA, Volvo-Cannondale), finished third, while **Michel Marosi** (CZE, Author RB Skoda Auto) was fourth and **Sean McCarroll** (AUS, Global Racing Team) fifth.

Top-qualifier **Nicolas Vouilloz** (FRA, Vouilloz Racing Team) crashed during his final run, but moves up to the overall lead, helped by the absence of previous leader **Fabien Barel** (FRA, Team GT) - who didn't race due to a leg injury sustained last week in Japan and drops to second overall.
