Chausson & Kovarik Win Maribor Downhill

Anne-Caroline Chausson (FRA, Volvo-Cannondale) returned to the top of the podium this weekend in Maribor, Slovenia when the champion rider won both qualifying and the finals of round 2 to earn a perfect 250 points and vault from 15th overall to 3rd. Then, in the men's final **Chris Kovarik** (AUS, Intense Cycles) won his third-straight world cup - his second this season in a closely-fought battle of the world's best.

The **Tissot-UCI Mountain Bike World Cup** continued its European racing this weekend, stopping for the fourth time on the Pohorje mountain in Maribor, Slovenia. Weather was sunny during Saturday's well-attended 4X event, but was cloudy Sunday and rained during the women's downhill finals.

With improving and stable weather, the men's race saw the top qualifiers nearly match their speed from the semi-finals, and produce very close times as was expected. When it was finished, series leader **Chris Kovarik** (AUS, Intense Cycles) had beaten last year's Maribor winner **Steve Peat** (GBR, Orange England) by the narrowest of margins, just .01 of a second.

Kovarik had surprised everyone in Scotland last week when won by 14 seconds, and did it again by beating top-qualifier Peat and **Fabien Barel** (FRA, Maxxis) by 1.27. It was another spectacular finish for the risk-taking Australian, who this week did his homework to extract all the speed and time he could.

Peat set the mark in qualifying, posting a time of 2:54. Kovarik was only .09 slower, and Barel just .22 slower. It promised to be a close final, and Kovarik was ready even if the track conditions were not ideal.

The rains stopped as the men began their runs and began to post close times with ten men remaining. Then fourth-seeded

Vouilloz broke the three-minute barrier, posting a time of 2:59.42 after a disappointing seeding run.

Barel was next, and claimed the hotseat with a run of 2:59.05 - leaving just Kovarik and Peat on the hill. Kovarik came down the mountain to post a 2:57.78. Then Peat finally came into view on the mountain, speeding between the grassy sections and bumpy tree paths through the woods.

Peat had posted an intermediate time that was .32 seconds faster than Kovarik, promising a close finish. But in the final tree section Peat had a bit of trouble, and lost just enough time to see his chance of a win disappear. "Going into the wooded section I hit the braking bumps and lost my line," said Peat right after his run.

"I'm disappointed about that small mistake, but the track had changed and I'm happy with the way I'm riding," Peat added. "And I got some good points in qualifying, so every point counts." Asked if he knew he had a winning run, Kovarik replied "I didn't know how I was doing until I came across the line. The only information you have is from qualifying, and I knew I was going a bit slower because it was more slippery."

Kovarik said the key was to be smooth. "There was no room for mistakes on this course, you just had to ride smooth and hold your speed around the corners."

Third-place Barel said he was pleased with his run. "I had a good qualifying run and was riding pretty aggressively with my new bike. I just wanted to make some points this afternoon. When I saw it was not too wet I tried to go faster and faster all the way down. I had a good sensation; smooth and not too much mistakes, so I'm happy."

Vouilloz matched his qualifying performance as well as his final from last week with 4th place, while Pascal rounded out the podium at 5th place. With his win, Kovarik increases his lead in the overall series to 55 points over #2 ranked Vouilloz.
