Lopes and Miller: Winning as Usual



The leading names of the 1998 began this year's Swatch-UCI Dual World Cup campaign in much the same way as they finished last year's - on top.

Deep mud at Les Gets, in France's Haute Savoie department, was a hindrance to all contestants on 22 May in the opening round of the eightrace Swatch-UCI Dual series.

Brian Lopes, 28, (USA) and **Katrina Miller**, 24, (AUS) slipped and slid their ways through the mud to reassert themselves as the world's top dual riders at the start of the new season.

Brian Lopes - USA

Lopes, from Laguna Beach, California, racing with his distinctive new "Lefty" one-armed fork, had to fight hard to overwhelm the young Slovakian contender, **Filip Polc**, 17.

A certain amount of physical contact and blocking is permitted in the sport of dual racing, and Lopes, seeing that Polc was about to go around him on a faster outside line, made a move that slowed the Slovakian's progress.

"I saw he was making a move on the outside, so I tried to slow him so he couldn't get past," explained Lopes. About his unorthodox new one-legged front suspension, Lopes said: "I have used it for two weeks now, and feel very confident with it - it works!"

The third place final was won by **Cedric Gracia** (FRA). "I am pleasantly surprised, I did not expect to do so well here. It is a good course for me, it is steep so I did not have to pedal much." Gracia beat **Eric Carter** of the USA.

The steep gradient of the Les Gets dual course was the subject of some discussion among riders. While Gracia liked it, Lopes said that on very steep courses passing manoeuvres are more difficult and that to get in front a rider has to go faster than he would like.



Katrina Miller had a comfortable win over Emma

Guy (GBR) in the women's final. "I didn't like the mud, you just had to follow ruts and stay loose," she said after her race.

Katrina Miller - AUS

Guy thought that her previous cross country racing experience had helped her gain the fitness for good results on the downhill. "I had a good winter's training and I'm really fit now...I pedal at every opportunity I get.... I am getting used to the start gates (used in dual racing)."

The race for third place was won by **Leigh Donovan** (USA), who beat **Sabrina Jonnier**.
