## Lopes and Chausson Tested, Still Win Dual #6

The two best dual riders of the season, **Brian Lopes** (USA, Volvo-Cannondale) and **Anne-Caroline Chausson** (FRA, Volvo-Cannondale), used all their speed and skill before a huge Japanese crowd to show why they're both leading the Tissot-UCI Mountain Bike World Cup Dual series Saturday evening.

Under clear skies and warm evening temperatures, round six of the Dual World Cup entertained thousands of spectators in the waning afternoon light, a small but powerful field of international riders flying high above a twisting course - and landing to the loud cheers of the crowd. After its debut here in 1998, the world cup series returned to the Arai Mountain & Snow Park for the first of three scheduled years of downhilling here - four hours from Tokyo.

The course, designed by *Glen Jacobs*, was in perfect shape for racing as no rain has fallen on the venue since riders arrived last week. The run begins with a nearly vertical stall wall, followed by several creative turns and then a huge mogul field of bumps. Then a table-top jump launched bikes before a hard banked turn an one last table-top before the finish.

Between the qualifying and final runs, organizers threw a big-air jumping contest, which was a huge hit with the fans. Several men competed for a Tissot wristwatch, with four judges selected from the crowd, holding score cards. **Cédric Gracia** (FRA, Volvo-Cannondale) was not only the crowd favorite, but the scorers' favorite as well, winning the relaxed competition with several impressive jumps over the course's first tabletop.

But then it was time for racing, and the men were all business as they competed for valuable world cup points. The men's race featured several exciting runs en route to the final two rounds, with riders doing whatever they had to, to remain on their bikes and in the running.

But in the final run, Brian Lopes (USA, Volvo-Cannondale) met up with **Wade Bootes** (AUS, Trek-Volkswagen) for the evening's title, the two meeting in the finals for the first time since the recent World Championships, where Bootes had beaten Lopes in a close run. This weekend's race was close as well, the two champions staying within inches of each other the entire run until the final table-top jump when Lopes barely edged out his rival to keep his season nearly perfect with five wins in six tries. In the mens' consolation round, **Mike King** (USA, Haro/Lee Dungarees) beat **Rich Houseman** (USA, Tomac) for third place. Afterward the riders moved down to a huge awards ceremony, where fireworks and traditional dancing entertained the assembled crowd.
