Sunn-Nike teammates Christophe
Dupouey and Miguel Martinez shared the glory at a thrilling final to the 1997 Grundig/UCI world cup at Annecy, France, September 6 and 7. In Saturday's final, Paola Pezzo (ITA, Gary Fisher) cruised to a relaxed win and claimed one of the few titles she has not won so far in what is becoming one of mountain biking's most brilliant careers.

The men's final was the most exciting thus far in the history of world cup racing. Starting the day three riders were in contention: Martinez, *Cadel Evans* (AUS, DBR) and Dupouey. Dupouey attacked at the start of the seven lap race and was soon joined by the maverick *Italian*, *Luca Bramati*. These two forged a lead over the rocky single track climbs and descents that mark this as one of the most technically challenging courses on the '97 circuit. Bramati departed at the start of the second lap when his re-inflation cannister malfunctioned after a puncture. Dupouey continued on his own and nobody was strong enough to catch him.

In the second lap, Martinez was worried by nerves and lost ground to Evans. For about half an hour the 20 year old Australian was leading the world cup overall: Dupouey was leading the race, Evans was second and Martinez was back in sixth. But it didn't stay stay that way for long.

"I felt like a bull in an arena, that all the public were after me. I'm not on form and I could see the World Cup slipping away from me. I knew I had to get back Evans and that's what I did."

Martinez came back to Evans, but so did Olympic in the series ahead of Evans who was third overall.

Meirhaeghe (RecordBank) was already with the Australian. "Evans and Martinez were looking at each other and I seemed to be in the middle. I didn't want to be the line victory - her eighth this season and with either of them, it was so tense," he said as attack and her sixth in succession. Starting the sixth lap Evans punctured and Martinez seized his chance. With only two laps remaining Evans realised it was all over. "What can you do?" He said. By the end of the race he had sustained a second flat. Towards the end of the race 1995 European champion, Jean-Christophe Savignoni (FRA, Look) moved up to Martinez and Meirhaeghe, while Brentjens and Arnould dropped back.

The last climb was an agonising affair with a trio trying to get what results they could. In the end Savignoni took second and Meirhaeghe third. But fourth place was enough to assure Martinez of the World Cup. At the age of 21 he is the youngest rider to win this trophy. It goes without saying that he also won the Under-23 World Cup.

"It has not sunk in yet, I expect it will do so when I step onto the podium," said Martinez about his win. He seemed a little shell-shocked after his nerve racking race. Dupouey's win lifted him to second overall in the series ahead of Evans who was third overall.

The women's final was relatively processional. Pezzo only needed 18th in the final to win the series, but instead she took the line victory - her eighth this season and her sixth in succession. "It is the realisation of a dream," she commented with a smile at the post race interview. Second place went to a resurgent Alison Sydor (CAN, Volvo-Cannondale), who was second in the series also. Third place in the series was won by Chantal Daucourt (SUI, Trek Volkswagen).
