Compared to the men's race, in which almost everything that could have happened did, the women's race was somewhat processional. Olympic Champion, *Paola Pezzo*, 28, (ITA, Gary Fisher), won by a huge margin, five minutes, twenty-eight, to be exact. Like Frischknecht, she attacked on the first climb of the race, and an attempt was made to follow her by *Chantal Daucourt* (SUI, Trek Volkswagen) and World Champion, *Alison Sydor* (CAN, Volvo-Cannondale).

The chase rapidly became a short battle for second place, which was also decided on the first lap, while Pezzo cruised to an easy win. "It was easier than last week," admitted the Italian, who looked as if shed done little more than a brisk one hour, forty-five training ride at the end of it. Daucourt took second place, almost three minutes ahead of Sydor, who looked pale and drawn at the finish.

Pezzo is finally starting to admit to a certain zone of comfort with her World Cup lead. She now has a 45 point cushion ahead of Sydor in the series. Sydor admitted that it was virtually impossible to catch the Italian now.

Mont-Sainte-Anne, which hosts world cup events in snow sports as well as cycling, will be the location for the Mountain Bike World Championships in September 1998.
