"It is the middle of the season and I'm feeling a bit tired," was the scarcely believable quote of Olympic Champion, **Paola Pezzo** (Gary Fisher) after winning the sixth round of the World Cup by a massive margin.

This was another taste of the tall Italian at her devastating best. If she continues with this form it is hard to see anybody else coming anywhere near her in any of the competitions that count most this year - namely the World Cup and World Championships. Pezzo rode away from the field on the first climb of the race and her competitors were left to wonder how she does it. "It was like she was on a motorbike," said third-placed Ruthie Matthes (USA, PowerBar), who decided against chasing as Pezzo disappeared into the intense heat of the long, slow ascent. Second was World Champion, Alison Sydor (CAN, Volvo-Cannondale).

Matthes, silver medalist at the 1996 World Championships, finished second here when the World Cup visited last year. Sydor was first, but then there was no Pezzo. Today Matthes tussled with Sydor for two of the three laps, but succumbed to a sharp attack by the Canadian near the top of the withering 5.6km climb and never saw Sydor again.

Sydor finished at four minutes, 26 seconds behind Pezzo; Matthes was a little over a minute further back. Next rider in, *Beth Coats* (USA, Ventana),

had the best finish of her career to date, but was almost 13 minutes adrift of Pezzo.

Despite winning four times in the World Cup so far this season, and finishing second in the other two races, Pezzo is far from certain that she will win the coveted title - even though she knows she is by far the best female mountain bike racer in the world these days. "I'm starting to feel a little more confident, but the top riders are still close to me in points."

Sydor, 48 points behind and second overall, doesn't quite see it that way. "I have no chance of catching Paola... but I can see why she is not confident. I was the same on my way to winning the World Cup last year. You cannot relax until it is over - anything can happen."

As a harsh reminder of that, *Caroline Alexander* (*GBR*, *Ritchey*), one of the two riders to beat Pezzo and claim a World Cup round win this year, fell during warm-up half an hour before the start and broke her clavicle.

Mount Snow, which with its abundance of great singletrack has come to be regarded by many as the eastern capital of mountain biking, has been a feature on the World Cup circuit for several years now, and both pundits and riders are coming to regard it as a classic. "It is the best course so far this season," said Sydor of the challenging loop. However, this event, which has seen some of the most exciting racing in World Cup history, is to take a break from the circuit for next year. It will be missed.
