## Venue: Spindleruv Mlyn, Czech Republic- XC#5- 10/11 May 1997

**Paola Pezzo** (ITA, Gary Fisher) sped to her third win of the '97 Grundig/UCI World Cup series, leaving an on-form field to ponder what might be in the second half of the series, which commences at Mount Snow, Vermont on June 21.

World Champion, *Alison Sydor* (CAN, Volvo-Cannondale) - looking her best so far this season - led the field through a frigid rain shower on the first of five laps, but was soon overhauled by Briton, *Caroline Alexander* (Ritchey), who towed a five rider group, also including Pezzo, *Chantal Daucourt* (SUI, VW-Trek), *Margariet Fullana* (ESP, Liberto Megamo) and last week's winner, *Alison Dunlap* (USA, GT).

Dunlap may have been on form at Budapest, but here she was clearly below her best, and was left behind on the second big climb of the circuit. Into lap two, Alexander held a slim lead ahead of Sydor, Pezzo, Fullana and Daucourt.

From the start of each lap begins a long, open, skislope climb on which a rider almost four minutes behind could see the leader at the top. On lap three, Alexander and Sydor could only watch as Pezzo rode away to open a 20 second gap on this climb, and then again as she extended her lead on the second climb on the lap. By the top of the first climb on the fourth lap, Alexander and Sydor, may have felt the tacky mud was like glue as not far ahead Pezzo worked her lead of about 43 seconds.

From there on, the Italian repeatedly took advantage of the open slopes to look back at her opposition, and an occasional smile on her face suggested that her glances were more to inspect the fruit of her labour than to assess her liklihood of being caught.

"It was like she was toying with us," said Alexander at the finish. Alexander had little trouble escaping from Sydor on the final lap, and closed Pezzo to 39 seconds, but the 27 year-old Olympic Champion from Boscochiesanuova, near Verona, never looked challenged. "I like this type of course: lots of steep, slow climbing," explained Pezzo at the finish. She went to on to say, "I want to keep the Blue Jersey, but we will have to see what happens in North America."

The next five courses will be typically more technical than the first five, and of course more US women will be present. It seems unlikely that the current top five or six riders will be displaced by others when the World Cup circuit enters its second half, what is interesting will be how much Alison Sydor and Caroline Alexander improve, and if Alison Dunlap can reproduce her racewinning form. Barring injury or illness, Pezzo, who has a commanding lead of 43 points in the series, is unlikely to lose the Blue Jersey. The race for runner-up is not yet settled, though.
