## **Evans Wins Title**

Christophe Dupouey flattens field for final win, but Cadel Evans is fast enough to protect series lead.

Cadel Evans (AUS, Volvo-Cannondale) finally received the pay-off he's been looking for, winning his first world cup title after several years of trying. He finished third in an exciting men's race on Sunday, battling with other top-ranked riders for critical final-round points. Christophe Dupouey (FRA, Sunn-Un) sped to victory with amazing speed as the field could only race for second place in the five and a half lap event. Team Volvo-Cannondale also won <u>vesterday's women's title</u> thanks to Alison Sydor and, as the top UCI cross-country trade team, won three world cup titles this weekend.

Sunday's weather was picture-perfect for racing with sunny skies, a slight breeze and an estimated 12,000 spectators in attendance. The men's points race was close this season, as it was for the women. In a situation similar to last season's final battle in Annecy between Evans and espoir rival *Miguel Martinez* (FRA, Sunn-Un), the Sunn-Un team had an opportunity - albeit a slim one - to manoeuvre their way to another individual title.

Martinez came into this race ranked third with *Rune Hoydahl* (NOR, Giant) in second. If Martinez won the race and Evans finished seventh or worse (from a crash and/or blocked traffic), the Frenchman would overtake the lead. Similarly, if Hoydahl could win with Evans finishing off the podium, he would capture the crystal globe trophy. "I wanted to win, but that [situation] was on my mind" said Evans. "If I'm going to risk everything to make up one place, I could lose the world cup and that's not in my favour."

While the chances were slim - considering the strength of Evans' riding - the possibility existed for Dupouey to allow Martinez to go off the front and slow the pace in the narrow wooded singletrack. Team tactics could again propel an individual, if the conditions were right.

But opposite circumstances presented themselves today with Dupouey, the stronger Sunn-Un rider, going off the front early with *Bas Van Dooren* (*NED*, *Be-One*). Even though he seemed to slow and look back for his team-mate, Dupouey couldn't deny his own strong legs and eventually rode hard to gap his chasers by over two minutes. "I attacked twice today," Dupouey said. "First to see if Bas could follow me, then again to get a gap. I was surprised how much time I got."

With Van Dooren flatting out, the chase group - which included Martinez, Evans, Hoydahl and *Hubert Pallhuber* (*ITA*, *Diamondback*) - was unable to reel in Dupouey who gained more and more time on the pack and calmly rode to an undisputed win. Besides, with the title on the line, it was this chase group most affected by potential points. Most of the chasers took their turn at the lead of the pack as Evans rode conservatively with Martinez to protect his season. After Pallhuber lead lap four, Martinez finally made a move in the last lap to leave his pursuers behind and ride to second place - right behind a waiting Dupouey. According to last year's title winner, he could have done even better today.

"I felt well at the end and made up almost the entire gap in the last lap," he said. "I could have gone another lap." According to Martinez, he felt strong all afternoon but let his team-mate capture his season's first victory. Evans was now able to ride conservatively to third place, the title secure. "I had to expend a lot of energy today, but I'm the world cup champion," he said. "Dupouey rode so strongly today. We were able to make up some time on the descents and in the singletrack, but he was stronger on the climbs."

Asked if he was concerned with possible Sunn-Un team tactics, Evans replied "They're both professional bike racers. I was concerned that if I ran into trouble and Dupouey heard about it, he could help Miguel. I didn't have a team-mate with me and Miguel did. And we had to chase Dupouey, because once he gets a gap, he holds it. But Miguel wasn't going to chase a team-mate down."

Pallhuber finished both the race and season ranked fourth while Hoydahl took fifth; third for the season. Martinez's strong finish catapulted him past Hoydahl for second overall as Rune was unable to stay in the four-man chase group in the last lap.
