Evans Wins Again

Breaking the spell of new winners each week thus far this season, number-one ranked *Cadel Evans (AUS*, Volvo-Cannondale) continued his domination of Elite XC mountain biking. The 21 years-old Australian star methodically picked off his rivals in a 139-rider field on the fast, hard Newnham Park course at Plymouth,

England.



Young newcomers to the circuit overwhelmed the established stars. 24 years-old Dutch star, Bas van Dooren (Be-One) finished only 12 seconds behind Evans, and third place came down to a sprint in which 23 years-old *Christophe Sauser (SUI*, DiamondBack) beat the 23 years-old Gregory Vollet (FRA, Giant).

Crashes, lead changes and sprint finishes marked the 53.9 km race over the technically demanding Newnham Park circuit. Until the closing minutes it was impossible Although by three years the junior in the lead to predict a winner.

The Action

First to the front was British favourite *Nick Craig* (GBR, DiamondBack) who led through the start loop, followed by team-mate Sauser. These two pulled a long string of men up the first grassy climb and maintained the lead until the backside of this first loop, some 6km into the race. At this point *Filip* Meirhaeghe (BEL, Mt. Dew/Specialized) was in the lead pack, Evans was in 10th and Bas Van Dooren (NED, Be-One) was buried deep in the pack. Van Dooren later commented "I was 15th or 20th in the first ready to give credit where it is due. lap - last week I worked too hard (early on) so this week I tried to ride smarter."

Meirhaeghe attacked with enough authority to look unstoppable. But *Miguel Martinez* (FRA, Sunn-Un), who had been yo-yoing between 4th to 9th place moved today... Cadel didn't have to work so hard." up quickly and - starting the notorious Pipeline Descent

The lead group was testing each member. It was moving fast and not giving an inch, the slightest mistake was penalised by a time gap. Van Dooren's teammate Patrick Tolhoek (NED, Be-One) went to the front, while Pallhuber chased with Sauser, Van Dooren, Evans, Vollet and Christophe Dupouey (FRA, Sunn-Un) in tow. Tolhoek's intention was to soften any tired legs, prior to a Van Dooren attack.



Halfway through the last lap, Van Dooren thanked his team-mate for the assist and blasted off the front. Only Evans mustered the energy to pursue in earnest. "On the last climb he attacked. I saw that it dropped Hubi and the others so I went after Van Dooren," Evans said. While Evans and Van Dooren rode clear, Sauser, Vollet and Pallhuber chased hard, and what had been a lead group was now a string of riders, each with several seconds between them.

duo, the diminutive Evans simply took Van Dooren apart with a series of attacks that gradually forced the gap wider and wider open ahead of the Dutch rookie rider. "I wanted to get in the front and be alone by the final loop," said Evans, adding "Every win is so important now, and I have four good scores so far. I'm verv *happy to win - especially with the number-one* plate and riding in my mother country." Evans was born in Australia to an English mother. For the second time in two weeks, he climbed the podium to receive both the U-23 and Elite series leader's jerseys. . "This is a great course today and the crowd was amazing," said Evans, always

"It was hard," said Van Dooren seeing first hand why Evans wears the number-one plate. "I was sure I was strong enough. but he attacked and I couldn't keep up. I think maybe I worked too hard - executed a passing manoeuvre on Meirhaeghe as the two flew down the impossibly steep, rutted escarpment.

The inevitable crash proved to be of major significance. According to Meirhaeghe "I was on the worn line going straight and Miguel went outside and cut in front of me at the worst time - I don't know why he does things like that." The result was that Martinez went headfirst into the dirt with Meirhaeghe right on top of him. After the field had passed by, Meirhaeghe picked himself up and continued, but Martinez was out.

With these two out of contention, a new lead group formed itself.

Christoph Sauser (SUI, Diamondback) went to the front and following closely in a group of nine was Van Dooren who had emerged last week in St Wendel as an on-form rider. These two, along with World Champion Hubert Pallhuber (ITA, Diamondback) and Rune Hoydahl (NOR, Giant), took

control of the race as it moved towards the fourth lap.



Van Dooren showed his hand in the fourth lap, making Pallhuber, Hoydahl, Sauser and Evans chase hard. But Pallhuber would not be intimidated and took the lead briefly until Hoydahl - who had been riding cute and quiet race in the lead pack - made a confident attack on the Continental Climb leading to the ultra technical Bomb holes section. His intention had been to use his superior skill to extend his lead there, but this plan was thwarted by a severe mechanical problem that forced his retirement.



Third place went to the young Swiss rider Sauser, a newcomer to the Diamondback team, for which he has taken an 8th in Napa, 7th in Budapest and now a 3rd here in Plymouth. It demanded a supreme last lap effort, though. Sauser found himself in a sprint with Vollet coming into the finish arena. "I had gone hard to stay in the lead group," he commented. "Vollet led going up the last climb, so I stayed with him, planning on making a pass in the last river. I stayed on him down the last descent and did pass him in the creek - then I just rode as fast as I can to stay in front on the sprint... it's hard on the grass!" he smiled.

Comment

With Vollet and Pallhuber rounding out the top five, there was an award ceremony in which three of the five riders were first-timers on the podium. Although the races look increasingly open, in becoming the first rider to win twice this season, Evans has identified himself as the one to beat this year. In the World Cup overall standings, Evans is now 97 points ahead of Meirhaeghe, his closest chaser.

Cross-Country racers will now take some time off for rest, recuperation and stage races before returning to the World Cup trail in Canmore, Alberta, Canada on July 4th.

Downhill racing resumes in Nevegal, Italy, on 23-24 May.
