Silves, POR- 18-19.4.98- XC#2-Evans Clinches Algarve Thriller

Cadel Evans (AUS, Volvo-Cannondale) came into round two of the '98 world cup with '6' on his numberplate and a yen for a smaller figure by the next event. In a thrilling climax to the race, Evans (21) escaped from a fast-moving train of four riders to take his third world cup win in two seasons.



World Cup leader, *Rune Hoydahl* (NOR, Giant), who was favourite to win on this technical and fast-moving course, controlled second place for much of the race. When Evans went off the front, however, he surprised Hoydahl, who had temporarily let *Dario Cioni* (ITA, Mapei-Kona) take the Australian's wheel. Hoydahl went on to take second, and comfortably held off '96 world champion *Jerome Chiotti* (FRA, GT) in third. Cioni produced his usual early season form with a powerful performance for eventual fourth while *Christophe Dupouey* (FRA, Sunn) rode a less consistent ride over the rolling hills to round out the top five.

What made this race special was the sight of four men, riding minutes ahead of the pack, yet inseparable until the sixth-lap shootout. This was classic spring action, in which riders, lacking lateseason confidence play a more cautious game.



The field broke up early when Cioni jumped away in the parade lap, which preceded seven full circuits of this testing course. He was the only parade lap leader to maintain his speed and continue up front all afternoon. Riding fast but conservatively, Cioni slowed to

On lap five Evans' effort paid off. The lead group attained a momentum quite separate from the rest of the race and a big gap appeared behind them. Cioni, who had taken a rest on being caught, had recovered and was driving the pace at every opportunity. "Our group got quite a gap quickly," Evans later commented. "Everyone was pushing the pace."

Martinez, *Bart Brentjens* (NED, Mt.Dew/Specialized) and *Lennie Kristensen* (DEN, Giant) dropped out, making up some of the 54 men who didn't finish today's hot-paced event.

On the sixth lap, Evans started to get ideas about winning the race. He realized he had to build a big lead on the climb to protect himself against any late-race attacks by the capable descender Hoydahl. Evans flew up the main hill, going - as he put it - "flat out."

Hoydahl was caught by surprise and missed the move. He gave a determined chase, but was still 4 seconds adrift by the end of the lap. When the climbs of the final lap began, Hoydahl realized that today Evans was the stronger rider, and from there onwards rode to protect the Grundig Blue Jersey.

On a triumphal roll, Evans accumulated nearly 30 seconds lead over Hoydahl, who was the only one to put up any serious resistance. His lap six attack had devastated his rivals. Early on the last lap, Chiotti and Cioni were more than a minute behind, and losing ground rapidly.

Waiting at the finish line beneath a steep switchback descent, the crowd soon realized Evans had risen to the occasion today as he effortlessly rode the last section and entered the stadium area before Hoydahl was even down the final drop. With his carefully timed attack and then a succession of killer punches, there were shades of Vail and Wellington '97 about this win by Evans. When Evans is on, he doesn't mess around.

Confirming that he had made his move on lap six's climbs, Evans commented "You've got to go flat out on the climbs as well as the descents. I was confident today - I rode the climbs a few days ago and thought 'maybe I can win this one' - sometimes you have a feeling. This course must have suited me; I guess if you win, it suits you!" Borrowing a mobile phone to call his mother in Australia - even though it was 3 a.m., Evans relayed the message back to his homeland, where a former national road coach has identified him as Australia's best Tour de France hope.

allow a small chase group to catch him rather than try to stay away on his own.

But the 23 years-old Italian found himself riding solo again when Miguel Martinez (FRA, Sunn) quickly lost the lead group, as did early front-runner Andres Brenes (CRC, Ritchey).

The cast of riders who would ultimately dominate was set by the end of the first lap. Not far into lap two, Cioni had 25 seconds' lead on Chiotti, and in the third lap still had a gap on Hoydahl, Dupouey, Chiotti and Evans, who one hour into the race had formed an alliance to bridge up to the young pretender.

But it was a flimsy pact with no agreement beyond catching the leader. On the fourth lap Cioni was netted and the lead group exploded. A stream of riders blazed past the thousands of spectators in a cloud of dust and cheers. Chiotti passed three riders and took the lead. Hoydahl rode in second, Cioni was back to third and Evans, sensing a main move, made overall, with Frischknecht in third. a big effort to catch the express train before it picked up too much speed. Dupouey dropped three positions **Ari Cheren** and was a minute back by now, while Ritchey riders Brenes and Thomas Frischknecht (SUI) rode together three minutes behind.



"Yeah, Cadel attacked and Dario couldn't follow," summed up silver medalist Hoydahl. "I tried to close the gap to Evans late in the race but I saw that he was too strong today and knew I had no chance. This race was really good for me though, and I'm happy to retain the leader's *jersey.*" Hoydahl has 193 points, 18 points of Evans in the
