## Silves, POR- 18-19.4.98- XC#2-Pezzo Back on Top

Paola Pezzo (ITA, Gary Fisher) put on a powerful display of climbing to overtake rival Alison **Sydor** (CAN, Volvo-Cannondale) in both today's race and the overall world cup standings. Alison **Dunlap** (USA, GT) finished third for the second time in as many races, with Laurence Leboucher (FRA, Peugeot LaPoste) and Margarita Fullana (ESP, Mt. Dew/Specialized) rounding out the top five.



Beginning the four-race spring round of the cross country mountain bike world cup, this was a fivelap endurance test which tough course would serve up, the women started slowly. While Dunlap, Pezzo, Fullana and Sydor

lead the parade starter lap, it would be hours before these same women would finish the race still in front - albeit in different order.

Going into the first full lap, Jimena Florit-Juarez (ARG, Headshok) briefly led the field before the first event of these spring races, but I'm Sydor took over. Fifteen minutes into the race, Sydor and Dunlap led Pezzo by several seconds. After losing Dunlap on the descents, Sydor looked to put time on Pezzo and rode hard toward the end of the lap. On the final descent into the start/finish, however, she crashed and lost her lead. Not far behind, Pezzo passed Dunlap and began chasing Sydor in earnest.

Pezzo caught the Canadian and powered into the lead on lap two, on the climb up to the course's highest point. Dunlap chased at 30 seconds, while Fullana and Chantal Daucourt (SUI, Trek Volkswagen) led a group two minutes back. By the top of lap two, Pezzo had opened a 12 second gap from Sydor. "I was very strong on the climbs today, but Alison [Sydor] was faster on the flats," Pezzo later commented.

As the race passed the half way point, it was clear that Pezzo was maximising her climbing advantage, and on the third lap increased the gap to Sydor by 25 seconds, with Dunlap about one minute back.

With victory in her sights, Pezzo continued to extend her lead and crossed the finish 1:22 ahead of Sydor and 3:02 ahead of Dunlap. It was an impressive ride for a rider who claims to be still below her best.

For Pezzo, today's win was a welcome return to the top, even if she doesn't feel in top form yet. "It was very hard and steep!", she exclaimed. "My legs felt good, but my back is still a bit weak and I don't really feel like I'm in lasted just over two hours. top form yet." Asked about her battle with Sydor, Aware of the demands this Pezzo said, "she is very strong right now, but I saw her struggle a bit on the climbs, so I attacked. She gained on the flats, but I was strong on the climbs."

> Sydor, while disappointed to lose the Grundig/UCI series leader's Blue Jersey, remained optimistic. "You look at where you're strong and try to limit your losses. It's tough for North Americans to come over here and race in looking forward to Budapest. I don't think I was a full 100% today and had to gain my time where I could. It was tough crashing like that after the first lap, because you work so hard for every second, and to lose it all like that is hard."



The other Alison - Dunlap - had another strong day for third place and was happy with her performance. "I have a new way of thinking now" she smiled. "Now I think 'I've gotta catch Sydor,' where I used to think 'Who's going to catch me?' I really feel like I belong up there now."
