St Wendel, GER- 9-10.5.98- XC#4-Meirhaeghe At Last

A thrilling sprint victory in round four, at St Wendel, made Filip Meirhaeghe (BEL, Specialized/Mt Dew) his formed to take advantage of the slipstream nation's first world cup round winner. After a race charged with energy, Meirhaeghe proved the strongest of a four-rider group, and out-sprinted Cadel Evans (AUS, Volvo/Cannondale), Rune Hoydahl (NOR, Giant) and Miguel Martinez (FRA, Sunn/Un).



Some 30,000 spectators were treated to an intensely tactical race, in which the lead group almost came to a track racing style standstill shortly into the final lap. Yet when the same four riders pedalled frantically towards the finish line, the time for hesitation was through. "I wanted to lead on the road (approaching the finish line)," said Meirhaeghe of the final kilometre. "On the last lap I thought about what it would take to win, and knew I had to (be) in the front," he added.

His thinking proved correct. The 52kg lightweight, Martinez could only watch when Meirhaeghe revealed his sprinting power, gained from pro road race experience with Brentjens this spring. Hoydahl also found himself short of pace. "When I saw Filip at the front at the end I thought he could do it today, because he is such a good sprinter," remarked Hoydahl, who finished third. Evans, another famous lightweight on the circuit, finished second here last year in a sprint with Frischknecht. This year, he wanted the win but finished a bike length short. "It's tough to lose another sprint here. It came down to who had the most kick at the end, and Meirhaeghe had it," admitted the young Aussie. Consolation for Evans came in the form of his placing ahead of Hoydahl. In doing this, he took the Blue Jersey from the Norwegian's shoulders and the 21 years old now leads both the Elite and U-23 categories of the World Cup.

As the race continued under a hot May sun, gaps opened up in the woodland sections, and then closed on the open tracks, where echelon lines effect. Thomas Frischknecht (SUI, Ritchey), the winner of round three, at Budapest last week, still felt tired and dropped out.

Van Dooren was reeled in, and on the fourth lap Meirhaeghe and Hoydahl looked in control. Evans made occasional appearances at the front, testing his rivals and looking for a leader. At the finish he said: "Everyone was looking to each other. to take the lead, but no-one wanted it. we stayed active 'though, and kept the pace up so we wouldn't be caught."



It was not a good day for the French. Chiotti was dropped from the lead group, and Martinez and Dupouey struggled to stay in contact. Of the five riders, Evans, Hoydahl and Meirhaeghe looked the ones most likely to produce the winner.

Starting the final lap, when these five slowed almost to a standstill, Chiotti and Van Dooren exploited the indecision at the front and almost rejoined the lead group. This acted as the catalyst and the final five kilometres was ridden with an urgency seldom seen at this stage of a race. In the final woodland section, Dupouey lost contact, setting the stage for a four-way sprint for the line. It was one of the most exciting mountain bike races anybody could remember.






The decisive move at St Wendel was made on lap two of seven. Bas Van Dooren (BEL, Be-One) attacked and Next race: Round five, Plymouth, England, 16pulled a small group away from the string of 130 riders. Christophe Dupouey (FRA, Sunn/Un) was in this group, working for his team-mate Martinez. Evans and '96 World Champion, Jerome Chiotti (FRA, GT) had recently joined onto the back, while Meirhaeghe and Hoydahl worked hard with Dupouey to keep Van Dooren close.

Meirhaeghe's win has been a long time coming. The 27 years-old Belgian had been crowned the unofficial junior world champion back in 1988, but as a senior he was in danger of being overlooked by the top teams. After several years that mixed disappointing results with flashes of brilliance, in 1998 Mountain Dew/Specialized team manager, Gert-Jan Theunise acknowledged his potential and gave him a place alongside 1996 Olympic Champion, Bart Brentjens. Only four races into the first season with his new team, Meirhaeghe rewarded his manager's faith. "The finish was a sudden release of energy for me, I didn't know I had that much! I've dreamt of this day for so long, I can't believe it," the affable Meirhaeghe smiled.
