Martinez Starts Supreme

In his first World Cup race as a full Senior, the Under-23 world champion **Miguel Martinez** (*FRA*) blasted off the front of the lead group and set himself up as the rider to beat this year.

Race Summary

Miguel Martinez started the season at his devastating best. He waited until lap two and then attacked on the intricate single-track downhill after the Disco Flyover. **Jerome** Chiotti (FRA), Bas Van Dooren (NED), Rune Hoydahl (NOR), and Cadel Evans (AUS) were the closest riders to Martinez, but none were able to counter his move.

On the fifth lap, Evans got away from his group containing Chiotti and **Gregory Vollet** (FRA), and closed the gap to Martinez from 45 to 20 seconds, but Martinez responded and finished with a margin of one minute. Vollet took third place after fending off Chiotti. Hoydahl, who had bent his rear derailleur on lap two and had had to dismount occasionally to repair it, made a big effort late in the race and moved up from sixth to fourth place.

Chiotti, the 1996 world champion, led the race on the second lap, and was in the lead at the time Martinez attacked.

On lap three, the 4.1km Calistoga Climb thinned the field, and passing over the Disco Flyover, after 1km of descending, Martinez was 15 seconds clear of Evans and Chiotti; Van Dooren and **Dario Cioni** (*ITA*) followed at 35 seconds; Vollet, world champion **Christophe Dupouey** (*FRA*), Hoydahl and **Filip Meirhaeghe** (*BEL*) were at 45 seconds.

Duouey then punctured shortly before this point on the fourth lap, and after losing 1min 53sec with the tube change finished 19th.

Vollet moved up to join Evans and Chiotti near the end of the third lap, which prompted Evans to attack on Calistoga Climb. By the top of the climb Evans and Vollet were 8 seconds clear of Chiotti.

Evans then attacked Vollet on the descent and a lap later was 12 seconds clear. Evans continued his push and looked likely to catch Martinez, but the Frenchman had sufficient energy to conserve his lead.

Vollet held off a late challenge by Chiotti and finished third, the best result of his career to date.

Early withdrawals from the race were Thomas Frischknecht (SUI), who retired on lap one apparently because of an upset stomach, and 1997 world champion, Hubert Palluber (ITA) who went out with a broken rear derailleur on the second lap. Michael Rasmussen (DEN) completed the first lap in second place but then retired from the race, reason unknown.

Miguel Martinez, 1st

• "I am very, very, very happy to win today... I attacked when I saw Chiotti was looking a bit tired and was slow on the descent... I got nervous when Evans was chasing me, because I though he might catch up...

(Asked if tired) No, not really."

Cadel Evans, 2nd

• "I have to be happy with this result. Miguel was so good today, what can you do about it?... I read an article saying last year's world championships was a bit like a French national championships, so when I found myself riding with Vollet and Chiotti, with Martinez in the lead, I decided I'd better attack - I didn't want that to happen again!"

Gregory Vollet, 3rd

• "There was a big group at the start and I decided to wait before riding hard. It's the first race of the season and I didn't really know how I felt. In the middle of the race I feld really good and so I attacked and caught up Cadel Evans and Jermone Chiotti. I was a bit cautious on the descents today because of the risk of a puncture or a mechanical problem. One accident can finish the race."
