

Diesel/UCI Mountain Bike World Cup - 1999

Plymouth, GBR - xc#5 - 15-16 May 1999 - Report / Rapport - women/femmes Fullana Wins a Thriller

Spain's **Margarita Fullana** scored a surprise win in a thrilling fifth round of the Diesel-UCI World Cup, at Plymouth on 15 May, by out-sprinting the powerful *Norwegian* **Gunn-Rita Dahle**.

On a mild, sunny English spring day the light and powerful duo of Fullana and Dahle blazed away from the field on the first of four laps of the 10.5km Newnham Park circuit. They remained inseparable until the finish line.

Even though the first lap of the race was shortened to 7.5km, the two leaders opened a substantial 16 seconds lead over World Cup series leader **Alison Sydor** (CAN) at the start of the second lap.



A further eight seconds behind Sydor at the start of lap two came '96 Olympic champion, **Paola Pezzo** (ITA), who later pulled out of the race complaining of back spasms.

Sydor rode the entire race alone in third position.

The next group of riders in this field, which had been blown apart by the ferocity of Fullana's early attack, contained **Barbara Blatter** (SUI), **Caroline Alexander** (GBR) and **Alison Dunlap** (USA). Blatter went on to finish fifth, one place behind the strong-finishing *Italian* **Annabella Stropparo**. Dunlap took seventh, and Alexander finished 11th after appearing to suffer from a puncture or mechanical problem on the second lap.



The race on this technically challenging circuit, with its steep climbs and intricate singletrack, was dominated by Fullana, whose unrelenting pace made it difficult for Dahle to take a turn at the front.

When it came to the sprint for the finish line, Dahle, the bigger of the two was expected to power past her rival, but Fullana - who has more experience of road racing than Dahle - was able to rise to the challenge and hold her position.

Dahle, who is still suffering from a broken rib sustained at round three, would have been hoping for a win today. If Sydor had been in fifth place or lower, this would have earned her the world cup leader's jersey. But this was never on the cards, since Sydor wheeled in two minutes and five seconds later, comfortable in third place just ahead of her team-mate Stropparo.

About Margarita Fullana-Riera

Fullana, 27, from *St Lornenz*, *Mallorca*, who has a reputation in road racing as a formidable climber, started the season with no world cup round wins. She now has two after winning at <u>Madrid</u> in the third round.

Her training programme, devised by former road racer Gert-Jan Theunisse, includes gymnastics to help improve dynamic balance, a critical component of mountain bike racing.

Before this season, Fullana's previous best results in mountain bike racing were third in the world cup rounds

at St Wendel last year, and at Houffalize and Annecy in '97; and third at the world championships in '97. Fullana has already been confirmed as a rider on the Spanish Olympic team for the mountain bike event at Sydney 2000.

QUOTES - paraphrased

Margarita Fullana (ESP), 1st

"I had no goal here and there was no pressure... I liked the course but I didn't like the river crossings... Gunn-Rita (Dahle) was not in front very much, I kept the rhythm going at the front."

Gunn-Rita Dahle (NOR), 2nd

"I'm very disappointed to be second today... Today Margarita (Fullana) was strong, it was her race. She was just stronger than I was today... Margarita was riding the technical sections better than I was... I still have a problem with my broken rib, but I don't really feel it while I am racing, only after I stop."

Alison Sydor (CAN), 3rd

"I've been away from home for a long time. I'm looking forward to getting back to BC (British Columbia) to recharge my batteries."
