## Blatter and Evans Repeat Wins at World Cup Round Seven



One week after winning round six in the Canadian Province of Quebec, **Barbara Blatter** (SUI, Scott USA) and **Cadel Evans** (AUS, Volvo-Cannondale) repeated their stellar form to win the penultimate round seven in Alberta. Racing in cool and dry conditions in the spectacular Canadian Rockies, the Tissot-UCI Mountain Bike World Cup prepared for its final showdown in Switzerland in September with a small but powerful field of riders in Canmore.

Number-two ranked Barbara Blatter (SUI, Scott USA) took the lead of the women's four-lap race Sunday morning, after she and **Alison Sydor** (CAN, Volvo-Cannondale) built a quick gap in the first lap. Sydor actually overtook the lead in lap one, out-descending Blatter on the steep wooded drops, but Blatter was too strong on the many long climbs and used them to build up a gap of 25 seconds within two laps and finish 42 seconds clear. She won not only the race, but the overall series lead as well.

"I'm in really good shape right now," said Blatter after her win. "I need to work on my descending though! I just did my race and won - I enjoyed the climbs, and want to keep up my fitness level the rest of the

season, since the finals are at my home.'

While Sydor chased Blatter, fueled by the loud cheers of thousands of spectators who lined the long figure-eight course, *Volvo-Cannondale* teammate **Alla Epifanova** (*RUS*) rode in third position the first half of the race before catching Sydor in lap three. The two then teamed up and rode the remainder of the race together, until the final lap when Sydor rolled to the finish just ahead of her teammate.

"Alla was riding really well today, so we rode together," said Sydor about her teammate. "We came together about half way through the race - she had her head down so we didn't say much to each other, but I knew it was important for her to get points for her national team and I wanted the world cup points."

"It helps a lot to work as a team," agreed Epifanova. "We worked like a team, and I liked the course. This race and the European championships are for Olympic selection, so the points are important."

Chrissy Redden (CAN, Gary Fisher/Saab) rode in 4th position the entire race, as the top four positions remained mostly unchanged after the opening minutes. But in 5th and 6th positions, **Jimena Florit** (ARG, RLX Polo Sport) battled with overall leader **Alison Dunlap** (USA, Team GT) until lap three when Dunlap overtook the 5th position for good. Florit ended up in 6th with her best-ever world cup finish, while Dunlap's 5th place finish lost the leader's jersey to Blatter.

Blatter's finish moved her to the lead of the world cup series, as she won her season's third race and looks forward to the finals in her home country of Switzerland where she hopes to wrap up the overall. Dunlap may not attend those finals, as she plans to race two European road races in preparation for the Olympic games.
