Double Win for Team Subaru-Specialized

Marga Fullana (ESP, Subaru-Specialized) and Filip Meirhaeghe (BEL, Subaru-Specialized) repeated their victorious results from round three of this season, when the two elite cross-country pros gave their team a pair of impressive wins to finish out the 2000 season in Lausanne, Switzerland. With rain and mud the most determining factor on a long 9 km course, both riders met the challenge and ground their way through the woods outside this picturesque Swiss city to put an important stamp on their season finales.

The men's race was one lap longer than the women's, and took ten minutes longer to complete. 108 competitors started their race in dry conditions - but would experience a heavy downpour right in the middle of the event - turning sticky mud into thinner, runnier mud.

A group of five men quickly established themselves off the front of the race, with five laps and a start loop looming ahead of them. The group consisted of Filip Meirhaeghe (BEL, Subaru-Specialized), **Thomas Frischknecht** (SUI, Ritchey), **Roel Paulissen** (BEL, Team GT), **Miguel Martinez** (FRA, Full Dynamix) and **Michael Rasmussen** (DEN, Haro/Lee Dungarees) - the same group that had battled several weeks ago in the European championships.

And again, not everyone was able to maintain the scorching pace, as the lead group became one smaller in the second lap when Martinez lost several seconds and rode in 5th position. He was in a three-man battle for the world cup overall, but his rivals - **Christophe Dupouey** (FRA, Team Giant) and **Bas Van Dooren** (NED, Be-One) were several minutes behind him.

Filip Meirhaeghe led the other three men into the third lap, while Martinez continued Miguel Martinez - FRA to chase along with **Christoph**

Sauser (SUI, Volvo-Cannondale). Thomas Dietsch (FRA, Bianchi) rode back in 10th position, but would begin to move up toward a podium position. By the end of the third lap, Thomas Frischknecht (SUI, Ritchey) - who until this season had won at least one world cup per season - took over the lead in the mud - conditions that favored him. Indeed, the other two leading men were keying off of him as they knew he'd be motivated to do well on this day.

Heavy rains began falling at this point, making the conditions even tougher. Frischknecht led through a technical muddy section,

carrying his bike cyclo-cross style while Meirhaeghe and Paulissen chased within 10 seconds. Rasmussen and Martinez were now a minute back and riding together.

By the middle of the fourth lap the same three men; Frischknecht, Paulissen and Meirhaeghe were clear of the other chasers, as a minute separated them from Martinez and Rasmussen. But within just a few minutes - during the course of one section in the woods - the gap between the front three and chasers went from one minute to two as the three worked together - and against each other.

"Thomas was running faster through the mud," said Meirhaeghe. "I attacked in the second lap, but he passed me again. Then in the third lap I said to myself 'Don't give up,' and I came back and gave it everything I had."

Frischknecht would gain time in the muddy climbs, Meirhaeghe would gain it back on the descents and open road sections, and Paulissen began to lose contact with the two front runners.

In the final lap Meirhaeghe's attack finally succeeded in breaking Frischknecht, and he put 19 seconds on the Swiss star by race's end - denying him the win and earning his second world cup victory of 2000.

"I was feeling very good today," Meirhaeghe said as he wiped the thick dried mud from his eyes. "But it was hard, so I'm happy to win here. This is the first season where I've won two races, and I think I'm ready for the Olympics."

For Frischknecht second place was his season's best world cup result, but far from what he was hoping for. "Filip was the strongest as you could tell, but I feel that I was kind of pushed a little bit into the leader position, because they both knew I was desperate to win that one race," he said.

"It was really hard, and I knew this was my last chance, my only chance - and this is now the first year I'm not winning a world cup race and I'm kind of sad - but I gave it my all and it just was not enough. But I'm still pleased with second place."

Paulissen eventually finished two minutes back, also with his best-ever world cup finish. "I'm good in the mud, and my season usually gets better toward the end," he said. "This is my first podium, and it's a good feeling - I'm stronger than ever and will try to keep my strength to the Olympics."

Miguel Martinez moved up one position for 4th place and, with his rivals Van Dooren in 20th place and Dupouey in 37th, he held onto first place overall and won the 2000 world cup championship. "I'm very happy to win the overall," he said. "Along with winning Worlds it's my second big satisfaction of the season. I just tried to keep my bike together and stay ahead of Bas and Christophe." With the Tissot-UCI Mountain Bike World Cup now wrapped up for the season, the cross-country riders now turn their eyes to Sydney and the pending Olympic games, where 30 women and 50 men will compete for the sport's biggest prize in three weeks.
