Cross-Country Season Begins in Napa



After months of training and preparing by the hundreds of elite athletes that form its ranks, the **2001 Tissot-UCI Mountain Bike World Cup Cross-Country** series finally got underway in the scenic vineyards of the western United States this weekend - with a pair of exciting races through the grape vines of *Domaine Chandon in Napa, California*. Surrounded by thousands of spectators who came to witness the first stop of the XC tour, two champions demonstrated their unbeatable form to claim both win number-one of the season and the coveted **Tissot** leader's jersey as well.

Spain's **Jose Antonio Hermida** (Bianchi Albacom) parlayed his 2000 U-23 World Championship to his first-ever world cup victory Sunday afternoon, just hours after 2000 World Cup Champion and Olympic Silver Medallist **Barbara Blatter** (SUI, Specialized) dominated the women's field to continue her powerful streak of performances.

Conditions were variable on Sunday, as both women and men competed on the rocky grounds of this famous sparkling wine producer. Rain fell just after the completion of the women's race, as well during the men's race - affecting the male riders as they negotiated the course's technical sections. Temperatures were chilly for most of the day, with sunlight peeking out only intermittently during each race.

MEN:

Where the women's race was a demonstration of power by established top finishers, the men's race held several surprises in its five-lap event. One surprise was the unpredictable weather, which brought short but intense rainstorms onto the track during the race, making for muddy descents and unpredictable racing conditions.

Another surprise was just how strongly a trio of riders established themselves at the front of the race by the third lap, as **Jose Antonio Hermida** (ESP, Bianchi Albacom) hooked up with Saturday's time trail winner **Marco Bui** (ITA, A.S. Marin Helly Hansen) - and a new face in **Marc Hanisch** (GER, Orbea).

These three put ten seconds on a hard-charging men's field after the first lap - and were pursued by **Christophe Dupouey** (FRA, Team Giant), **Martino Fruet** (ITA, Ritchey-Yahoo!) and **Lado Fumic** (GER, Telekom Mobile). But no matter how hard the experienced

men tried to catch the breakaway trio, they were unable to reel them in, and lost more and more ground as the race progressed.

Hanisch, who recently won a race called the Cantú Cup in Italy and is a two-time German National Champion, showed that he is a new name to learn this season on the world cup circuit as well, as the 26-year old kept pace with the better-recognized names of U-23 World Champions Hermida (2000) and Bui (1999) throughout the gruelling event.

While these three worked as a unit to put a gap on the field, behind them the established riders unsuccessfully tried to mount a counter-attack. First Lado Fumic rode a solo chase in the third lap as Dupouey and Dubau chased together. Behind them were **Filip Maerhaeghe** (BEL, Specialized) and former teammate **Bart Brentjens** (NED, Team Giant) - along with early race leader **Ryder Hesjedal** (CAN, Subaru - Gary Fisher).

In the penultimate lap four, Fumic and Dupouey hooked up in pursuit of the leading trio, while **Gregory Vollet** (FRA, Creuse Oxygene) rode his own solo pursuit.

At this point the attacks for the win began to materialize, as Hanisch made his bid for a stunning upset - but was reeled in and replaced in the lead by Hermida, Bui keeping a close watch on his rivals. By the end of the last lap the order was finally settled, as Hermida shook off Hanisch by 8 seconds, Bui following 4 seconds further back, giving Hermida his first-ever world cup victory.

QUOTES

Jose Antonio Hermida, 1st Place:

"I didn't know I could do it - it was so exciting. I just tried to do my best and then at the end I had a bit of problems, so I start to think I would lose the race. But then I tried to motivate and at the end I was pushing hard, so I saw I could do it. All the time we [top three] tested each other when we were together. Everyone was attacking, but also no one wanted to lead, but at the end everyone was battling for themselves. I made the final attack on the little climb, then when I caught Marc I attacked again and got a few meters - so I attacked again. For me it's more important to win a world cup than the World Championships here because I was fighting so hard to get my first world cup win."

Marc Hanisch, 2nd Place:

"I was feeling good today, so I thought I could finish well. After my success in Italy I knew I was strong, but I didn't expect to be this strong today - especially with these muddy and technical conditions. It seemed like everyone was falling down behind us three leaders, which maybe helped us get away a little bit. Also, Marco Bui was leading for awhile, and that helped us get a gap. I attacked on the last lap and was leading with about 2km to go, but then Hermida counter-attacked and passed me.
